# Support continues to grow

The Felpham Village Conservation Society has grown in numbers and influence since the new committee took over in April 2014. We have regained financial stability, put on many different activities and responded to important community consultations.

In particular we have set up three Working Groups to get to grips with the business of "conserving the historical, cultural and aesthetic significance of our built and natural environment". These are the History, Heritage and Archive Group, the Conservation and Development Group and the Friends of Old Rectory Gardens Group.

New members are still needed to strengthen the Society and to continue to build the Society's funds to a sustainable level. Membership not only enables the Society to get on with critical work for Felpham but also offers a range of activities during the year.

Two important things are taking place in Felpham this year. First will be the review of the Conservation Area being undertaken by Arun District Council. Second will be the very first Felpham Village Summer Fete in Old Rectory Gardens on July 11th. We hope this will become an annual event but help will be needed on the day so let us know if you are available.

### Getting on with job

The Society has set up the Conservation and Development Working Group to look at developments that might affect Felpham. A first action was to send a list of 'shabby areas' around the Parish to Arun District Council to investigate under Section 215 of the 1990 Town and Country Planning Act and negotiate improvements with the relevant property owners.

In 2014 we responded to two traffic consultations. First, the CPZ, which we were against on the grounds of open access and urbanization and we are pleased this scheme was



rejected. We have been welcoming and open to visitors and want to stay that way. However we did recognize that some specific areas especially around Sea Road are overwhelmed with cars during the summer and need a solution.

Second was the Felpham 20mph zone. We supported this as we are in favour of anything that could reduce speeds but were sceptical about a speed limit that the police have said they will not/cannot enforce. This is part of a several road mitigation measures resulting from the new Site 6 housing.

# New-Felpham Village Summer Fete!

The Society is perhaps best known for providing the Felpham Village Christmas Tree Celebrations. This year we will be organising the very first Felpham Village Summer Fete in Old Rectory Gardens on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July from 12 – 5pm. It will be a fun-packed traditional summer fete



with all the old favourites - a coconut shy, tombola, tug-of-war

and lots of children's games. The Society will be hosting a teatent and a BBQ together with the Snooks Corner Group.

As well as a variety of stalls from local retailers and organisations, there will be a full entertainment schedule including a brass band, local school choirs, dancers and a guitar and mandolin duo to get your feet tapping! A fun dog show is also planned. Entry to the fete will be free. If you would like to help on the day or have a stall yourself, please contact us.

#### **Conservation Area Review**

The Felpham Village Conservation Area was first set up in 1985 after pressure from the Society that had been started in 1980. Arun District Council has started a process of reviewing all its conservation areas and as Felpham was one of the first to be established it is one of the first to be reviewed. Hopefully the



consultation will be carried out later this year. Once it is underway, the Society will send out the details and hold its own member meeting to gather views and define responses. One particular issue is the inclusion of Church Field in the Area. The Society were one of several Felpham organisations pushing for this with a petition in 2013 which gathered over 1200 signatures.


#### Three social events for 2015

#### **Supporting Blake Cottage Purchase**

The Big Blake Project together with the Greener Bognor Network organised the Blake Festival with art, poetry reading, drama and story telling last September in Old Rectory Gardens to coincide with the start of the fundraising campaign for the purchase of Blake's Cottage. FCVS supported the event with cream teas in the Gardens.



A substantial start has been made leaving about £350,000 to be raised through loans in the short-term. # **Old Rectory Gardens Facelift**

A lot has happened since the Society took over the Friends of



Old Rectory Gardens role last year. Arun District Council have cleared the overgrown hedge on entry from the west and will also now clear some of the area to the south whilst retaining the wild element. They have also cleared a pathway through the impenetrable copse opposite The Fox so we can now get in with some work parties. As yet no 'wishing well'!

Arun has produced a management plan and we have been asked to help with the future vision and we have already started with a tree survey.

Regular gardening groups were started at 2pm on the fourth Friday of each month. These will be continuing again this year with the next session on March 27<sup>th</sup>. Bring your own gloves and tools.

#### Felpham History – Past and Future!

Felpham, or Felcheham, has a long and fascinating heritage



and history through the ages from medieval times through to the thriving village we know today, but how will future generations view our generation?

The History, Heritage and Archive Group has been formed with a duel task - to

gather together as much as possible about the past, and to create today's history by producing archives for the future. We will use a mix of talks and displays, particularly using the Society website for archiving the many aspects of Felpham. Books, pamphlets, maps and postcards are all needed to add to the Society's collection on Felpham past. Audiotapes, photographs and written reflections are all planned for future generations.
